## The crisis in the regional parties

Although the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)'s spectacular victory, and the rout of the Congress, in the 2019 election has elicited most public attention, there is a third dimension to the verdict. India's major regional parties, and those who see themselves as a possible third front of Indian politics, have also faced major setbacks, throwing many of them into crisis. From the leading social justice parties of the Hindi heartland to regional formations led by veteran leaders in the west or south, there is a sense of shock about the scale of the defeat and anxiety about what lies ahead.

Take the nature of the crisis first. The Rashtriya Janata Dal did not win a single seat in Bihar. Its supremo, Lalu Prasad, remains in jail; there is a feud among his sons; and the man hailed as his natural successor, Tejaswi Yadav, has failed to lead the party in this election. Come to Uttar Pradesh. And despite a formidable alliance on paper, Samajwadi Party (SP)'s Akhilesh Yadav has failed to improve his party's 2014 tally in the Lok Sabha. The SP has five seats; his own family members, including his wife Dimple, lost; and there are murmurs of dissent. Bahujan Samaj Party's Mayawati saw herself as a possible Prime Ministerial candidate. She may have improved her tally to ten seats, but her fourth successive electoral loss and the steady inroads being made by the BJP into her Dalit base would be matters of grave concern. In the east, Trinamool Congress' Mamata Banerjee now faces a critical challenge in the upcoming assembly elections. Go west, and Sharad Pawar's (NCP) final gambit to become Prime Minister now lies in ruins; recovering ground for even the state assembly polls at the end of the year in Maharashtra will be difficult. In the south, another PM-hopeful, HD Deve Gowda, has failed to win his own seat. The Janata Dal (Secular) is struggling to remain in power in a fragile coalition. One of the key movers behind the anti-BJP front, N Chandrababu Naidu, was routed in both the Lok Sabha and the assembly polls. And finally, the Left — particularly the Communist Party of India (Marxist) and Communist Party of India — are now staring at political oblivion.

Put it all together and it is clear that Indian politics is going through a fundamental churn. The first assumption — only regional parties can represent regional aspirations and they are set to dominate national politics — is under challenge. The second assumption — caste-based parties have formidable, unbeatable arithmetic on their side — has been shattered in the heartland states. The third assumption — coalitions of regional parties will make them invincible — is under strain in a situation in which the BJP has got over 50 percent of the vote share in over 15 states. And the final assumption — federalism will inevitably weaken the centre — is now coming untrue, for India could well be headed for more centralisation under the second NDA government. The Left, regional parties, and old Mandal formations have a lot to think about.

## How the BJP is increasing its vote share in the South

On May 23, standing next to a tea stall I heard a hushed retort, "His name is not Rahul Gandhi. He is Rahul Khan. I am happy he lost." A man who seemed to be in his mid-30s told the tea vendor, referring to Congress president Rahul Gandhi's rout in Amethi. We were in Hyderabad, the capital of the youngest South Indian state, Telangana. In the state, the Lok Sabha verdict was composite — the regional party, Telangana Rashtra Samithi, won nine out of 17 Lok Sabha seats, the Congress won three and All Indian Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimen retained its single MP seat in the state. The only surprise that greeted Telangana was the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)'s improved performance. And that explained the whispers in tea stalls, the growing number of WhatsApp forwards favouring the party and Hyderabad-based trolls who indiscriminately target anyone criticising the BJP.

In 2019, the BJP in Telangana upped its seat share to four against the one it secured in 2014. The party also improved its vote share from 10.5% to 19%. Most important, it pulled a shocker — the contest in Nizamabad where TRS's Kalvakuntla Kavitha, incumbent MP and daughter of Chief Minister, K Chandrababhai Naidu, lost to the BJP's D Aravind by a margin of 70,000 votes. A bloc of 176 turmeric farmers who fielded themselves as candidates, thanks to the growing distress in the agriculture sector, killed Kavitha's chances by polling a total of 98,000 votes. This favoured the BJP, and how. The BJP was able to take on a strong regional party with a vote share of 41.29% (2019) because the electorate considered it a viable alternative

even if the endgame was to rout an incumbent MP who failed them during her last term. In the past, that alternative would have been the Congress, which had a formidable presence in Telangana, a part of united Andhra Pradesh before 2014.

While the south largely bucked the national trend by limiting the BJP's seat share to 29 out of its 128 members of Parliament (MPs), lone trends like that in Telangana suggest that the BJP is a growing presence in the five states located south of Vindhyas. For starters, in three out of five southern states — Karnataka, Telangana and Kerala — the party improved its vote share either marginally or substantially. In Kerala, where the Congress won 15 out of 20 seats, the BJP improved its vote share by 2.48%. Moreover, the Congress' victory in the state was largely the result of voter dissatisfaction which the BJP engineered to target the Left Democratic Front during the 2018 Sabarimala temple controversy. Topping that, in Karnataka and Telangana, the BJP's vote share improved by 8.01 and 8.5 percentage points respectively.

In Andhra Pradesh, while the party's seat share dipped by 7.52%, thanks to the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) wave, which won 22 out of 25 seats, the BJP has not lost favour completely as YSRCP president, Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy, is keen on keeping a distance from the Congress to protect his vote base. Against these state wise performances, it is safe to say that strong resistance to the BJP with a clear mandate against it came from a single state in the South: Tamil Nadu.

## That time...when my electricity bill 'shocked' me to the core!

Then one of us (it was me!) had the better sense to cross-check our bill with electricity board officials! Turned out, they had added an extra zero to our bill! We were saved by a zero. My wife believes that she is better predisposed to run affairs of the house. I often told her just that she had never let me try and I would prove better if she let me. Well, I fell flat on my face last summer! My wife was away from home for a family wedding in May and I was to join her later. On the day I was to leave, I cross-checked if I had locked properly and left. We were away from house for about five days. When we returned and stepped into our bedroom, we found it was freezing. My face fell as my wife glared at me for five minutes without speaking a word.

That month, the electricity bill was up by almost 40 % and I learnt the obvious truth — women are better home managers. Perhaps all these people would be happy to know that there exist air-conditioners that can actually stop their electricity bills from spiralling upwards. Yes, that's right! ## BJP's next target 333 in 2024 Lok Sabha polls with focus on south

In an attempt to increase its footprint in the southern states, the BJP will recast itself as a pan-Indian party and not a "Hindi-speaking outfit" in time for the next Lok Sabha election, senior functionaries said

333. That's the target for the Bharatiya Janata Party in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, according to the party's national secretary in charge of Andhra Pradesh and Tripura, Sunil Deodhar. The party won 282 seats in 2014 and 303 in 2019. But it wants even more.

"Our core mandala is from West Bengal to Tamil Nadu and to make inroads for 2024, if we have to reach our 333 mark, then we will have to focus on these states along the coast line," said the key strategist who has moved from the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) to the party.

In an interview to Hindustan Times, Deodhar however points out that Mission 333 can be possible only if BJP overcomes the perception of being a party of and for "Hindi" speakers. He adds that he has started to learn Telugu, and that he mastered Bengali after being asked to help oversee the party's march in the East and the North East.

"If you want to get to the heart of things, you have to know the language," he said. In an attempt to increase its footprint in the southern states, the BJP will recast itself as a pan-Indian party and not a "Hindi-speaking outfit" in time for the next Lok Sabha election, senior functionaries said, adding that the party has begun preparation for strengthening its organisational structure in four of the five states in Southern India, which bucked the national trend by not voting for the party in the recently concluded Lok Sabha polls.

The idea, one of these functionaries said, is to deliver results similar to those in West Bengal, where its tally went from 2 to 18.

"We will build the party structure from scratch: panna pramukhs at the booth levels will be appointed, the party together with the RSS will identify issues that need to be highlighted. For now the focus will only be on the party and not building alliances," this person said.

Other BJP leaders have a more nuanced take. The BJP's national general secretary Murlidhar Rao, who is in charge of Karnataka, channeled the Prime Minister's speech to say that it is about "national ambition and regional aspiration".

"So linguistic communities' identity will be balanced in Hindutva nationalism." The next target is the assembly polls in some of these states, he added. Deodhar said that BJP's success in Karnataka was because it was more of a mainstream state. Unlike the other states like Tamil Nadu and Telengana, the JD(S) didn't have a reach all over Karnataka, only certain areas, he added.

According to the party functionaries cited above, in the five southern states, the BJP will start holding meetings to discuss the way ahead. The first such is scheduled for Tuesday in Kerala.

According to a BJP functionary from Kerala who asked not to be named, a change in guard in the state is unlikely, but the party will take stock on how to reclaim the vote bank that moved away from the CPIM to the Congress, in the aftermath of the Sabarimala judgment that allowed women of all ages to enter the sanctum sanctorum of the temple.

"We paved the way for the change of guard after raising the Sabarimala issue, but unfortunately it was the Congress that swept the anti-CPIM vote. With 40 MLAs and past experience of being in power in the state they were better equipped to fight the CPIM," added this person.

In Kerala, where the BJP's ideological fount, the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), runs the highest number of shakhas across the country, the party walked away with 12.9% of the total vote share but no seats. It expected to win at least three seats, including Thiruvananthapuram, from where the Congress' Shashi Tharoor retained his seat.

In Andhra Pradesh, the party received only 0.9% of the total votes polled, less than the NOTA percentage of 1.49%; three senior functionaries will be sent to the state to take stock. Deodhar, Rao, and Rajya Sabha MP GVL Narasimha are expected to tour the state to seek feedback from the office bearers and the candidates.

In Telengana and Tamil Nadu, the party wants to focus on consolidating voters across castes. "In Karnataka what worked for the party was consolidation of the voters who were hitherto divided on the basis of caste. Getting the support of the Lingayat (upper caste) and the non-dominant Other Backward Classes (OBC) was critical to the BJP's win," said a BJP leader from Tamil Nadu who asked not to be named. On whether the party will rethink on its alliance with the AIADMK, which won just one seat in the Lok Sabha (from 37 in 2014), this person said that the BJP has "already indicated that no matter how strong a party gets we will work with alliance partners.

Ever since the achievement of independence India has been assiduously striving for the promotion of peace. She has unbounded faith in peace. She believes that peaceful conditions alone can hold out any hope for the deliverance of mankind from the rut of so many ills it is at present plagued with.

Mahavir Swami and Gautama Buddha tirelessly preached against all kinds of violence. Their teachings were no heeded, but also acted upon by Indian emperors. Mahatma Gandhi has said that "Peace will not come out of a clash of arms but out of justice lived and done by unarmed nations in the face of odds." Hence world peace is more essential not only for India's economic development, but also for the economic development of all the backward countries of the world. Peacemaking should be purposeful and positive.

## Trump in Japan, Taiwan holds military drills and other news in pictures

Kaga, a helicopter carrier designed to carry submarine-hunting helicopters to distant waters. is claimed by Beijing. During the event, the Vice President released the documents on "Implementation of India's National Biodiversity Action Plan: An Overview" 2019, and 'Biodiversity Finance Plan' Working Document, and some other communication material. Call for India Biodiversity Awards 2020, fifth in the series, was also launched through the release of a brochure and poster. A thematic exhibition was also organised at the venue with the participation of over 30 institutions. Interesting exhibits, posters, and other knowledge products highlighting the role of biodiversity for food and health were depicted at the exhibition. The Vice President walked through the exhibition and appreciated the exhibits.

New Delhi: Today, IAF successfully fired the BrahMos air version missile from its frontline Su-30 MKI fighter aircraft. The launch from the aircraft was smooth and the missile followed the desired trajectory before directly hitting the land target.

The air launched BrahMos missile is a 2.5 ton supersonic air to surface cruise missile with ranges of close to 300 km, designed and developed by BAPL. The IAF became the first Air Force in the world to have successfully fired an air launched 2.8 Mach surface attack missile of this category on a sea target on 22 Nov 17. Today's was the second such live launch of the weapon. The integration of the weapon on the aircraft was a very complex process involving mechanical, electrical and software modifications on aircraft. The IAF has been involved in the activity from its inception. The software development of the aircraft was undertaken by the IAF engineers while HAL carried out mechanical and electrical modifications on the aircraft. The dedicated and synergetic efforts of the IAF, DRDO, BAPL and HAL have proven the capability of the nation to undertake such complex integrations.

The firing could be successfully undertaken with dedicated support from Indian Navy by way of ensuring availability of a large number of monitoring ships to ensure range safety clearance. The BrahMos missile provides Indian Air Force a much desired capability to strike from large stand-off ranges on any target at sea or on land with pinpoint accuracy by day or night and in all weather conditions. Air Marshal R Nambiar PVSM AVSM VM & Bar ADC, Air Officer Commanding-in-Chief Western Air Command & Kargil veteran, was also a part of the formation. The 'Missing Man' formation is an aerial salute accorded to honour the fallen comrades-in-arms. This is an Arrow Formation, with a gap between two aircraft in the formation depicting the - Missing Man. Later, in a sombre ceremony, he laid a wreath at the War Memorial to honour the IAF men who made the supreme sacrifice in the line of duty.

It was on this day in 1999 that, Squadron Leader Ajay Ahuja Vrc (Posthumous) laid down his life during the Kargil conflict. He was at that time the Flight Commander of 17 Squadron. On the 28 May the CAS will visit Air Force Station Sarsawa and fly in a Mi-17 V5 Missing Man formation to commemorate the Kargil martyrs. It was on 28 May 1999 that we lost a Mi-17 helicopter after successfully attacking the enemy in Drass sector. Squadron Leader R Pundhir, Flight Lieutenant S Muhilan, Sergeant R K Sahu and Sergeant PVNR Prasad died in action in that Mi-17 helicopter.

## MHA asks States/UTs to take adequate security measures in connection with counting of votes tomorrow

New Delhi: Ministry of Home Affairs has alerted the State Chief Secretaries and Directors General of Police regarding possibility of eruption of violence in different parts of the country in connection with the counting of votes tomorrow.

MHA has asked the States and UTs to maintain law & order, peace and public tranquility. States/ UTs have been further asked to take adequate measures for the security of strong rooms and venues of counting of votes. This is in the wake of calls given and statements made in various quarters for inciting violence and causing disruption on the day of counting of votes.

## Central government extends ban on LTTE for five years

New Delhi: The Central Government has extended the ban on the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) for another five years under sub-sections (1) and (3) of section 3 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 (37 of 1967) with immediate effect. The notification in this regard was issued here today.

The notification states that the LTTE's continued violent and disruptive activities are prejudicial to the integrity and sovereignty of India; and it continues to adopt a strong anti-India posture as also continues to pose a grave threat to the security of Indian nationals.

## 47 illegal Bangladeshi immigrants rounded up

AHMEDABAD: In view of security concerns for the forthcoming Rath Yatra of Lord Jagannath on July 4, special operations group (SOG) of the city police has started rounding up Bangladeshi illegal immigrants. On Sunday, SOG rounded up 47 Bangladeshi illegal immigrants from different areas of the city including Danilimda, BRTS bus stand, from near Chirag Park Society, Naroda Patiya, from near Ambika Bridge in Vatva and from Juna Vadaj. ACP, SOG, B C

Solanki said five teams were formed under instructions of the joint commissioner of police, J R Muthaliya, and the anti-terrorism squad as illegal Bangladeshi immigrants have the chance of being absconding criminals in their own country, or may have links with terrorist outfits. "The teams rounded up such Bangladeshi immigrants who had sneaked into India through the India - Bangladesh border at West Bengal," Solanki said. "None of them had proof of

being Indian citizens, or valid visas and most confessed that they had come here in search of work. They are mostly involved in petty jobs and also begging," Solanki added. The backgrounds of the Bangladeshis are being checked to verify whether they are involved in criminal activities, said SOG officials. "In the past, we have found many such Bangladeshi illegal immigrants to have escaped to India after committing serious crimes in Bangladesh. Some

arrested earlier also had links with terror outfits," said an investigator. ACP Solanki said they have initiated legal process to deport the illegal immigrants back to Bangladesh, even though many of them manage to sneak back. "We have come across such Bangladeshi illegal immigrants who have been rounded up more than once clearly indicating that they manage to sneak back into India after deportation," a senior SOG official said.

## Cellphones worth Rs 14 lakh stolen in Bodakdev

AHMEDABAD: An employee of branded gadgets shop on Sunday filed a complaint with Vastrapur police of burglars breaking into the shop on Sindhu Bhavan Road in Bodakdev area of the city and decamping with high-end cellphones worth Rs 14.21 lakh and Rs 1.50 lakh in cash. According to the FIR filed with Vastrapur police, the incident occurred on the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday when seven burglars, who were seen in CCTV footage, broke into the shop and decamped with 35 cellphones of a branded company.

Dhaval Patel, a Ghatlodia resident who works as store manager in the shop, stated in FIR that he closes the shop at night before leaving. As he was on leave on Saturday, another worker, Hitesh Dhorajia and one Ronak locked the shop on Saturday night. On Sunday morning, when two employees — Kaushtubh Patel and Puja Patel reached the shop to open it, they found the shutter broken. When they went inside, they also found the anti-theft siren was active and some drawers were open. When Dhaval was informed by the two co-employees, he called up cops and a team of Vastrapur police reached the shop. During primary investigation, police found that

cellphones, which were kept for display, were stolen. Besides, a drawer, in which cash was kept, was also broken using an iron rod. A CCTV footage of the incident shows two burglars sneaking inside the store room. They broke a drawer and stole the cellphones. In another footage, two other burglars were seen entering the shop. The third CCTV footage shows seven burglars, carrying bags on their shoulder, calmly walking down Sindhu Bhavan Road. Vastrapur police registered a case of burglary and began an investigation. No arrest has been made so far in the case.

## AMC goes all out to make Amdavad safer

AHMEDABAD: The Surat fire tragedy that killed 22 was a wake-up call for everyone. After ordering closure of all tuition classes in the city within hours of the tragedy, AMC chief Vijay Nehra had more to do. On Monday, the city witnessed a spate of demolitions, sealings and issuance of notices. In three days, 2,952 notices were issued, out of which 833 were issued on Monday alone. The Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) on Monday demolished illegally constructed structures in parts of the city. The civic body demolished structures at a total of 25 premises including seven hospitals, five tuition classes, six schools, five restaurants and two commercial complexes. While nine demolitions were carried out in North Zone, six were in south zone, two in east, three in west, two in central, three in south-west and one in north-west zone. South Zone: Sardar Patel Hospital, Nelson School and Body Carpenter Gym.

## Eight cases of cholera reported

AHMEDABAD: Eight cases of cholera were reported in Ahmedabad this month till May 25, according to data given by the health department of Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC). The weekly health report released by the AMC indicates that two of these cases were reported in Amraiwadi area of the city while three were reported in Danilimda and Behrampura areas of the city, among others. In all, some 1,413 cases of water-borne infections were reported in Ahmedabad, indicates the report, till May 25. These include 865 cases of vomiting and diarrhoea, 172 cases of jaundice and 385 cases of typhoid. The cases of typhoid have already witnessed an increase against last year, when 359 cases were reported in the entire month of May 2018.

## Leg shortened by an inch, man gets Rs 4 lakh damages

AHMEDABAD: Twenty-one years later, a farmer from Godhra whose limb got shortened by an inch in an injury sustained in a truck accident, will receive a compensation of Rs 4.25 lakh. The Gujarat high court noted that the injury had left the farmer, who was 26 at the time of the accident, with permanent disability due to which he is unable to undertake heavy physical work entailed in farming. In an order released last week, the HC enhanced compensation for Mohammed Ibrahim Chanda from Rs 2.74 lakh awarded by the motor accident claim tribunal in 2007. The high court has ordered the insurance company and the parties involved in the accident

to deposit Rs 1.51 lakh more with 9% interest. Chanda was injured on June 7, 1998, while he was talking to a person on the roadside. A scooter was parked on the road and a truck, driven in negligent manner, crashed into the scooter hitting Chanda and others. One person was killed while Chanda was hospitalized for 76 days for an injury sustained on his left leg. He underwent a surgery. When Chanda came out of the hospital, he was certified as having 44% disability with reduction of one inch on his left leg. This left him with a permanent limping gait. Chanda was only 26-year-old at the time of accident. Chanda approached the tribunal in Godhra and sought

compensation of Rs 7 lakh. The tribunal ordered the owners of the truck and the scooter to pay him Rs 2.76 lakh. Chanda was not happy with compensation and moved the HC in 2008. Justice B D Karia concluded that Chanda was only 26 at the time of accident and was engaged in cattle selling as well as agricultural work. The tribunal had not considered the fact that due to serious injuries in lower limbs, Chanda would be unable to undertake agricultural activity. He would not be able to lift heavy materials. Hence, Chanda's compensation was enhanced, and the owners of the scooter and truck and the insurance company concerned have been asked to deposit the extra amount within eight weeks.

## Fire erupts at chemical factory in Sanand

AHMEDABAD: A major fire broke out at a chemical factory in Sanand town of Ahmedabad district on Monday afternoon. No casualties were reported in the incident, officials of the Ahmedabad Fire and Emergency Service (AFES) said. The fire broke out at around 2.30pm on Monday at

Nrup Reck Solvents and Chemicals at the Uma estate, 1km from the Sanand toll booth. As many as 60 AFES personnel and 14 firetenders were pressed into service, said the Ahmedabad chief fire officer M F Dastoor. It took 3 hours to douse the blaze, Dastoor said. Another official said the blaze occurred due to a

chemical leak and it spread across the unit, where solvents and other chemicals were stored. Due to the heat, the solvent caught fire and this went out of control, said the fire official. The fire spread rapidly through the entire unit, forcing workers to rush out. Fire official said that the fumes from the fire at the unit were hazardous and person exposed to them would

faint immediately. As the unit was located in an open area, the fumes did not harm anyone. This is the second fire at an industrial unit in Gujarat this month. On May 27, a major fire broke out in a chemical unit at the Vapi GIDC industrial estate, in which two workers suffered injuries.

## Gujarat government checking 3 buildings per minute

AHMEDABAD: The Surat fire tragedy that claimed 22 lives has drawn a knee-jerk reaction from the state government prompting it to go into a fire-safety check overdrive. Though annual fire safety inspection figures are not available for the state, according to government figures the state officials on Saturday, Sunday and Monday inspected a total of 11,550 commercial buildings across the state for fire safety! This translates to around 3 building inspections per minute round the clock. Mukesh Puri, principal secretary (urban development), government of Gujarat, on Monday said that buildings found flouting norms have been served notices. "We are adopting zero-tolerance policy against such hazards. All the establishments functioning from terraces and basements have been closed with

immediate effect, even if they have paid impact fee to regularize it," he said. Just shutting down tuition classes won't do. The government should make fire drills compulsory at all coaching institutes, according to the GSDMA's 'Safe School' manual. Annual reports of such fire drills should be uploaded on a website or put in the public domain. Those not reporting should be penalised. Many tuition institutes still operate from buildings having a single exit and entry and are low-rise buildings. The government could consider suggesting additional structures for such buildings for easy evacuation. Puri was addressing the media on the report of the fact-finding committee on the Surat tragedy, which he led. "Public participation and awareness is

important. There were fire extinguishers in the complex. Some had got blasted due to intense heat whereas some remained unused as probably no one knew how to operate them. There would be a sustained drive to train building occupants - especially support staff present - in basic fire-fighting. It will start with corporations and go up to municipality level," said Puri. In direct response to the Surat incident, the state government will review use of flex banners over buildings. In the Surat tragedy, a vertical banner is reported to have played a major role in spreading the fire from the first floor to third and fourth floor. "Overloading of electric lines is another major issue. Even before the incident, the electricity company has served about 1 lakh notices to regularize the load capacity. We are

planning a drive to regularize it with the energy department," he said. Puri accepted that there is staff and equipment crunch especially in smaller cities and towns. "We looked into the claim that the fire brigade was late in reaching at the spot. But it was not the case - the first respondents reached the spot quickly but they only had a ladder of 10.5 metre which was not capable of reaching the top floor and rescuing people. We will devise a system where the hydraulic platforms, which could reach to the top floors, should be informed as quickly as possible," Puri said. "We are also assessing how many such specialized vehicles are required and where should it be deployed," he added.
